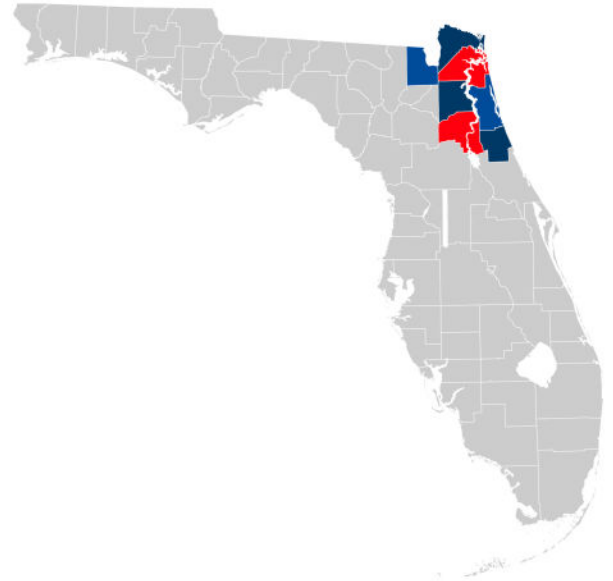




WHY JACKSONVILLE?

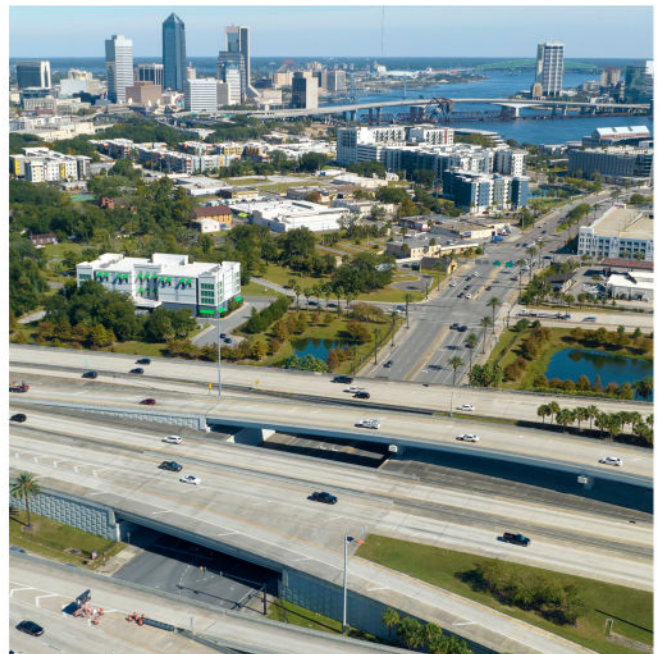

MEDICAL DEVICE MANUFACTURING

With more than 20 hospitals, an innovation-first business mentality and a strong logistics infrastructure, the Jacksonville region is a hotbed for medical device manufacturing in the United States.

Our reputation as a health care destination stimulates the production of medical devices in the region with hospitals such as Mayo Clinic, Baptist MD Anderson Cancer Center and UF Proton Therapy Institute, who are leading the way with medical innovation. These hospital systems provide innovative medical procedures, such as robotic-execution in cardiovascular surgeries and 20-minute minimally invasive valve replacement, laying a foundation for the region's medical device manufacturers to provide an environment to invent, patent and test products in real time.



AMERICA'S LOGISTICS CENTER

Over the years, there has been a significant investment in the region's rich logistics infrastructure and its key location as the westernmost area on the Atlantic Ocean which enables same-day access to 98 million U.S. consumers. The infrastructure found in the region's seven counties includes two deep-water ports, three interstates, three rail lines and an international airport system.

INDUSTRY HIGHLIGHTS

JOHNSON & JOHNSON VISION:

More than 1.7 billion disposable contact lenses are manufactured at the Jacksonville-based Johnson & Johnson Vision plant each year. In 2022, the company announced it would increase that production by adding 100 new jobs to their existing 3,500 Northeast Florida employees and investing \$200 million in the expansion of the building, machinery, equipment and infrastructure.

The biomedical manufacturing company has expanded multiple times in the Jacksonville region over the years, citing our available workforce, particularly military veterans; education; and lifestyle as key contributors to their success in Northeast Florida.

Florida is a national leader in clinical research, generating **\$8.2 billion in total economic impact** as of March 2025. The state ranks second in trial participation, with 102,016 participants and third in the number of active clinical trials, totaling 2,198 in 2023. Jacksonville is also tied with Miami for the most heart disease trials and ranking second in studies focused on diabetes and stroke. The region's research strength is driven by leading institutions, including Nemours Children's Health, Baptist Health, Mayo Clinic and University of Florida.

UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA IN JACKSONVILLE:

The University of Florida (UF), ranked as one of America's top public universities, has established a graduate campus in the heart of downtown Jacksonville. The campus will offer an initial nine graduate degrees and enroll up to 1,500 students.

The campus will focus on pioneering technology related to simulation, health applications of artificial intelligence, patient quality and safety, research and engineering, among other programs. This graduate-level campus joins engineering and research programs at nearby University of North Florida, Jacksonville University, Florida State College at Jacksonville, Florida State University, Florida A&M University as well as the Gainesville campus of University of Florida.

There are **more than 43,000 college graduates annually in medical device-related majors** within a 402-kilometre radius of Jacksonville.
